Winter Weekend—Guidelines

The following guidelines are for the safety & concern of all campers. Please read these guidelines and be aware that by signing your application to register for Winter Weekend, you are confirming your promise to conduct yourself in the following ways:

1. **Medication:**

Campers bringing any medication to camp must have medication in original containers. An adequate supply of prescribed medication must be sent for the duration of the camp.

2. **Condition of Dismissal:**

The Camp Director reserves the right to dismiss a camper who in his/her opinion is a hazard to the safety and rights of others, or who appears to have rejected the reasonable controls of Camp. The parents/guardians and the appropriate Ministry Unit will be contacted regarding transportation home.

3. **Promotional Material:**

I/We agree to permit the reasonable use of photos and videos or other pictures of the applicant camper in promoting camp or camp activities and programs. **Yes ___ No ___**

4. **Curfew/Attendance:**

I will respect the curfews and will not leave my room/lodge after hours.

I will not leave the campgrounds at any time without prior permission.

I will attend all scheduled activities.

5. **Refrain from following:**

The following items are not allowed at the camp and I will not take part in or bring these items to camp:

Tobacco Roughhousing Alcohol Drugs

Gambling Foul language Pranks

Inappropriate behavior with the opposite sex.

Inappropriate or revealing clothing such as short skirts, belly tops, strapless & low cut shirts.

Electronic devices are permitted but not in sessions. Music needs to be kept at an acceptable level for all.

6. **Accommodation:**

Males are not permitted in the female lodges. Females are not permitted in the male lodges.

Damage to the accommodation becomes the personal expense of the applicant.

I understand that failure to observe the above stated guidelines will result in disciplinary measures that may include my immediate dismissal and loss of my registration fee.

CANYON SKI RESORT – SKIER INFORMATION
PLEASE READ CAREFULLY!!!!

Canyon Ski Area has 11 runs that offer a variety of ski terrain for beginner to expert along with two chair lifts, two t-bars and a rope tow. Our centrally located two-story, 2200 sq. ft. lodge is beautiful and spacious with five fireplaces and a 300 seat capacity cafeteria. Over the past 20 years the **Canyon Ski Area** has put close to half a million people through our ski programs. All of our ski instructors are certified and our ski school is a member of the Professional Ski School Association.

1. **Canyon Ski Area provides rental equipment.** Bindings on the equipment are meant to reduce the risk of injury when falling but cannot eliminate it. Bindings may not release in all situations.
2. Skiing is a sport, like all physical sports there are inherent risks beyond the control of Canyon Ski Area.
3. Obey all posted instructions when using the lifts and **do not** cut into lineups and / or move quickly away from the loading area.
4. Please adhere to the following guidelines of common sense. Awareness which will help to reduce all elements of risk while skiing:
 - a) Always stay in control. You must be able to stop, or avoid other people.
 - b) People ahead of you have the right-of-way. It is your responsibility to avoid them.
 - c) You must not stop where you obstruct a trail or are not visible from above.
 - d) Before starting downhill or merging onto a trail, look uphill and yield to others.
 - e) If you are involved in or witness a collision or accident, you must remain at the scene and identify yourself to the Ski Patrol.
 - f) Observe and obey all posted sign and warnings.
 - g) You must keep off closed trails and observe all posted signs and warnings.
 - h) Do not attempt to stop runaway equipment – shout the warning “RUNAWAY SKI” or “BOARD” to people below.
 - i) It is recommended that beginner skiers/boarders take ski lessons to learn the rules.
 - j) Avoid cutting through ski classes.
5. Dress appropriately for the weather conditions. On sub-zero or windy days make sure your face is shielded by a high collar, neck warmer or face mask.
6. Recognize your limitations. If you are tired or cold, stop for a rest.

SAFETY POLICIES

1. ALL SNOWBOARDS AND SNOWBLADES MUST HAVE SAFETY STRAPS.
Straps available at Canyon for \$5.00 + gst: **Please be prepared to purchase straps if you do not have them.**
2. Do not knock skis together on chair lift, as they can come off and fall on people below.
3. When riding t-bar, stay in track, as lift can be damaged by leaving track. When riding rope tow, you must let go if you fall, do not let rope drag you up hill.

SKIER CLASSIFICATIONS

All participants registered for ski lessons should be classified according to skiing ability:

NON-SKIER	The individual has never skied before.
BEGINNER	The individual has skied once or twice and has experienced and maintained control on a number of <i>novice</i> hills.
INTERMEDIATE	The individual has skied on many occasions and has experienced a variety of hills and different <i>intermediate</i> areas of the ski hills. He/she can stop and turn under control.
ADVANCED	The individual is an experienced and competent skier. He/she has formal knowledge and understands all Skier's Responsibility Codes. The individual demonstrates ability at an <i>advanced</i> level.
